Allie Phillips is a nationally-recognized author, attorney and advocate on animal protection, advocacy, prosecution, the linkage between violence to animals and people, and promoting positive human-animal interactions. She is an award-winning author and licensed to practice law in Michigan and Maryland with significant trial experience as an Assistant Prosecuting Attorney in Michigan. She has been training prosecutors and criminal justice professionals since 1997. In 2003, she became a Senior Attorney with the National District Attorneys Association outside of Washington D.C. where she trained on child abuse trial advocacy techniques and strategies, interviewing children and preparing them for court, the linkage between violence to animals and children, and creating the innovative *Crawford* training program and case law update. In 2007, she joined American Humane Association as the Vice President of Public Policy and then Vice President of Human-Animal Strategic Initiatives. She managed the Washington D.C. office and was responsible for lobbying and advocacy on child and animal welfare legislation, drafting legislation and providing expert testimony to legislatures. She also developed and managed national initiatives on human-animal interactions, including the Pets and Women's Shelters (PAWS)[®] Program (now renamed Sheltering Animals & Families Together (SAF-T)[™]) and Therapy Animals Supporting Kids (TASK)[™] Program. In 2011, Ms. Phillips rejoined NDAA to launch the National Center for Prosecution of Animal Abuse and to integrate awareness of animals into child protection trainings, including training on the linkages between violence to animals and people, children exposed to animal abuse, and how therapy animals can help maltreated children.
